College of Arts and Sciences Career Faculty Excellence Award

The **Career Faculty Excellence Award** recognizes a career faculty member, from either the instructional or research track, who demonstrates sustained teaching or research excellence. Themes for nominations include but are not limited to:

- Outstanding instruction to our students
- Promoting pedagogical innovation
- Creating new knowledge centered on instruction
- Providing inclusive and engaged learning environments for our students
- Consistently making outstanding contributions to research and/or creative activities

Career Faculty Excellence Awardees will be chosen by the Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences in consultation with the Dean's Advisory Committee. Up to 2 awards will be made each year. Awardees will receive \$2500 (distributed as a stipend or professional development funds) and a certificate of recognition.

Career faculty members are eligible if they have a 0.5 FTE or greater appointment in the College of Arts and Sciences.

Each CAS department may nominate one career faculty member for this award each year. Nomination packages should include the following materials:

- A letter from the nominator (usually the head or director), not to exceed two pages, that addresses the nominee's accomplishments. The nomination letter should explain in detail and citing specific evidence how the nominee exemplifies excellence in teaching or research.
- A current and dated curriculum vitae from the nominee.
