Funding Specifics: Support for one year only. Only one application accepted from any one institution in any given year. Tuition waiver/coverage from home institution.

Div. 12/ Theodore Blau Early Career Award for Outstanding Contribution to Professional Clinical Psychology: \$2,000

Due November 19, 2020

\$2,000 to honor a clinical psychologist for professional accomplishments in clinical psychology.

Nominees should be no more than 10 years post doctoral degree.

Be a psychologist with an EdD, PsyD or PhD from an accredited university.

Individuals who represent diversity in race, ethnicity, gender, age, disability and sexual orientation. Candidates can be simultaneously considered for multiple awards, although a psychologist may receive only one Div. 12 award in any given year.

No voting members of the Div. 12 Board of Directors will be eligible to receive awards from the division while serving their term. **Self-nomination is permitted.**
