Visiting Clinical Assistant Professor of Counseling Psychology

Job Position Description

The Counseling Psychology Doctoral Program in the Department of Educational Studies at Purdue University in West Lafayette invites applications for a visiting clinical assistant professor. This position is a 1-year appointment covering the 2022-2023 academic year (10-month) with an anticipated start date of **August 2022**. This position is integral to the overall operations and oversight of the [Certificate of Collaborative Leadership \(CCL\) Program, which is a university-recognized undergraduate certificate program](#).

The CCL consists of three courses, taught primarily by our graduate students under faculty supervision. Two of the three courses are also part of the university core curriculum. Therefore, this position offers the opportunity to directly contribute to undergraduate instruction and curriculum development as well as provide instructional training and supervision of undergraduate course instructors.

Responsibilities

- Supervise graduate teaching assistants and professional-level instructors of undergraduate courses.
- Participate in direct observation of instructors and offer constructive feedback.
- Assist in the revision and updating of CCL course syllabi and curricula.
- Provide administrative support to the Director of the CCL Program.
- Teach courses within the CCL program. This position carries a 3:3 teaching load (3 courses in Fall semester, 3 courses in Spring semester). However, there will be one course release due to supervision of instructors.

Qualifications

Candidates must hold an earned doctorate from an APA-accredited program and have experience teaching undergraduate students. Applicants from clinically-focused programs (e.g., counseling psychology, clinical psychology, etc.) and experience in curriculum development and administration will be given preference.

The applicant should demonstrate a commitment to teaching and instruction in diverse settings, as well as a commitment to training and supervising instructors in effective and culturally proficient undergraduate pedagogy.

The visiting faculty member will be expected to espouse the counseling psychology program's commitment to excellence in instruction, engagement, service, diversity, equity, and inclusion.
