Clinical Assistant Professor of Counseling Psychology

Job Position Description

The Department of Educational Studies [www.edst.purdue.edu] at Purdue University in West Lafayette invites applications for a full-time, academic year (10-month) clinical faculty position in its APA-accredited Counseling Psychology Program beginning August 2022. We are seeking applicants who can contribute to our college mission of effecting positive change in a diverse society in the areas of discovery, teaching, and engagement. In addition to teaching responsibilities, this position includes the administrative titles/responsibilities of Director of the Purdue Counseling and Guidance Center (PCGC) and Director of the Certificate Program in Collaborative Leadership:

https://www.education.purdue.edu/undergraduate-students/collaborative-leadership-certificate/. The undergraduate Certificate in Collaborative Leadership (CCL) consists of 3 courses, taught primarily by our graduate students under faculty supervision. Two of the three courses are also part of the university core curriculum.

Responsibilities

- Teach courses in counseling psychology and supervise practicum. This position carries a teaching load of 1 course per semester (1 course in Fall semester, 1 course in Spring semester) in addition to the administrative responsibilities as the PCGC Director and Director of the Collaborative Leadership Program.
- As Director of the PCGC, the faculty member will oversee operations of the
 program's training clinic, which serves Purdue students and community
 members. Responsibilities include administration of the clinic's day-to-day
 functions and supervision of the student director of the PCGC, who is an
 advanced doctoral student in the program. The areas of specialization and
 theoretical orientation are open, but the applicant should demonstrate a
 commitment to effective delivery of counseling services to diverse constituents
 and to the values consistent with that of the program, including a social justice
 and multicultural focus, a strengths-based developmental perspective, and a
 scientist-practitioner model of training.
- As Director of the Collaborative Leadership Program, the faculty member will oversee the undergraduate Certificate in Collaborative Leadership (https://www.education.purdue.edu/academics/undergraduate-students/collaborative-leadership-certificate/), which consists of three courses taught primarily by counseling psychology graduate students. The applicant will: train, supervise, and provide feedback to graduate student instructors; schedule and assign course sections; identify, recruit, and train limited term lecturers; and maintain approval of courses as part of Purdue's core curriculum.

Qualifications

Candidates must:

- Hold an earned doctorate from an APA-accredited program in counseling psychology, clinical psychology, or a closely related field.
- Either be licensed in the State of Indiana and credentialed as a Health Service Provider in Psychology (HSPP) or be able to acquire these credentials within two years as a condition of ongoing employment.

Preference will be given to individuals with leadership and supervisory experience in a clinical setting. Clinical faculty are full members of the faculty and are expected to demonstrate excellence in the areas of clinical practice/application, service/engagement, and clinical/classroom education.

Purdue University's Department of Educational Studies is committed to advancing diversity in all areas of faculty effort, including discovery, instruction, and engagement. Candidates should address at least one of these areas in a separate Diversity and Inclusion Statement, indicating their past experiences, current interests or activities, and/or future goals to promote a climate that values diversity and inclusion.
