



Clackamas County Career Opportunity Health Promotion Coordinator – JO# 105343

The Clackamas County Public Health Division program seeks an individual experienced in coordinating and delivering health prevention and promotion programs to join the Population Health Strategies team. Building from data and community voice, Population Health Strategies convenes and engages partners to develop and implement sustainable community changes to improve health outcomes. We do this through public policy, organizational change, broad systems change, and improving the environment where we live, work, and play.

The individual in this position will develop working partnerships with state and local agencies, city governments, community organizations, service providers, local policy makers, local businesses, and schools. The Health Promotion Coordinator will work with lead staff to support a variety of population health programs, with a special focus on substance use prevention and education.

In collaboration with internal and external partners, the Health Promotion Coordinator will synergize activities to develop an area wide infrastructure for tobacco use prevention. The Health Promotion Coordinator will also support activities related to substance use prevention and education in the context of the opioid crisis with the goal of reducing overdose death in Clackamas County. The Health Promotion Coordinator may also assist the Population Health Strategies team in health assessment and project evaluation as well as development of new prevention and health promotion work. This position requires exemplary organization, communication skills, and relationship management skills, and would ideally be experienced in population health, policy, and/or public health program coordination as it relates to tobacco and/or opioids, and other addictive substances.

Required Minimum Qualifications/ Transferrable Skills:

- A Bachelor's degree in a human services field, public health, or health systems; or at least four years of job related experience in this field.
- At least 1-2 years' experience coordinating public health programing, including experience with public health assessment and evaluation.
- At least 1-2 years' experience collaborating with community partners to develop policy, systems, or environmental change programs.
- At least 1-2 years of experience with public health assessment and evaluation.
- At least 1-2 years' experience delivering presentations to public groups and schools.
- At least 1-2 years' experience creating multimedia materials to communicate public health messaging to a variety of audiences.
- Must successfully pass a criminal history check which may include national or state fingerprint records check
- Must successfully pass a post-offer, pre-employment drug test.
- Driving is required for County business on a regular basis or to accomplish work. Incumbents must possess a valid driver's license, and possess and maintain an acceptable driving record throughout the course of employment

Preferred Special Qualifications/ Transferrable Skills:

- Advanced degree in Public Health, Social Services, or similar degree.
- Experience in population health, policy, and/or public health program coordination as it pertains to tobacco and/or opiates.
