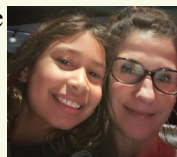

Dr. Camille Cioffi, a graduate of the 2020 Prevention Science Doctoral Program, is a Research Associate at the University of Oregon's Prevention Science Institute as part of the Center on Parenting and Opioids and is also affiliated with the Center on Human Development leading an evaluation of a youth suicide prevention program, Sources of Strength. She also works as a Research Scientist at Influents Innovations, through which she received her first federal grant from the National Institute on Drug Abuse as a Multiple Principal Investigator. The grant is a Small Business Innovation Research grant to develop a mobile application that will provide parenting support to fathers in recovery.
