Chapin Hall at the University of Chicago is seeking a researcher to work with a team on projects that generate data analytics and evidence to inform decision-making by public and private child-serving agencies, including child welfare and juvenile justice systems across the country. Projects focus on the analytic activities necessary to inform system planning and decision-making, including predictive risk modeling, latent class analysis, geospatial gap analysis, and other forms of analytic support. These analysis generate actionable evidence to guide the implementation of new initiatives including the Family First Preventive Services Act (FFPSA). Project methods may vary but include literature reviews, survey administration, and analysis of administrative data.

The Researcher's primary responsibilities include: Serving as the analytic project lead for more than one project at a time, facilitating meetings, developing and implementing data collection protocols, identifying appropriate analytic strategies, participating in research team discussions, conducting analyses of quantitative and qualitative data, consulting to the development of technological applications, and translating research findings into actionable policy guidance. Other tasks include conducting reviews and analysis of relevant literature and documents, guiding analysts' in analytic tasks, assisting with protocol development and IRB submissions, and writing sections of reports and helping produce other project deliverables.

The position will report directly to Dana Weiner, Policy Fellow.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS

The primary responsibilities of the position are as follows:

Contributes to the intellectual and scientific development of research studies and data



analytics including the development of study design and methods.

- Serves as the primary liaison for stakeholders participating in studies, and overseeing the transfer and linkage of administrative data for analysis.
- Translates research and analytic findings into actionable evidence and implications for system planning.
- Conducts analyses of quantitative and qualitative data, and may direct research and/or policy staff in analytic tasks.
- Writes sections of research results.
- Develops and delivers presentations of findings to diverse audiences.
- Assists with Institutional Review Board submissions.
- Represents Chapin Hall and its research agenda and establishes important stakeholder relationships, especially with partner agencies.
- Performs additional duties as assigned.

QUALIFICATIONS

Education

A doctoral degree in public policy, psychology, statistics, education, public health, sociology or another relevant field OR a master's degree plus a minimum of five years of relevant, post-degree experience required.

Experience & Other Qualifications

- A minimum of three years of experience with program evaluation, policy analysis, or evaluation work that cuts across or is at the intersection of multiple social service systems required.
- Experience conducting analyses of quantitative and qualitative data
- Strong knowledge of quantitative approaches to data analysis, including predictive modeling, machine learning, and latent class analysis.
- Knowledge of qualitative research methods, including the ability to develop data collection protocols required and conduct systematic reviews of literature.
- Strong interpersonal skills, with the ability to effectively manage key stakeholder relationships required.
- Strong communications skills with the ability to translate and convey complex concepts



and study findings in oral and written communications required.

- Strong project management skills, with the ability to manage multiple, concurrent tasks required.
- Problem-solving and analytic skills required.
- Demonstrated capacity for working in a collaborative research environment required.
- Ability to work independently with a high degree of initiative required.
- Demonstrated judgment and discretion in the handling of sensitive information required.
- Working knowledge of R, Stata, Atlas-ti, NVIVO, or other data analytic software preferred.
