

A one-year-long, remote, mentored research internship designed to increase knowledge and skills of students interested in community-based participatory research on economic/social mobility and early childhood education and care for African American children and families.

SCHOLARS WILL RECEIVE:

- Personalized cross-disciplinary training to strengthen their capacity to design and implement research that impacts African American children and families.
- Personalized mentoring from experienced researchers who will create an Individual Development Plan (IDP) for success.
- Opportunity to contribute to the evidence-base through peer-reviewed manuscripts and scientific presentations.
- A \$20,000 stipend that includes a weekly time commitment of 20-25 hours for the summer semester and 10-15 hours for fall and spring semesters.
- Additional financial support for professional development and travel to present research findings

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

- · Currently enrolled in an undergraduate or graduate program
- · Majoring in social work, public administration, public health, education, or related fields
- · Current junior, senior, or graduate student
- Cumulative GPA of 3.0 for undergraduates and 3.3 for graduate students
- · US Citizen or Permanent Resident currently residing in the U.S.
