Anna Cahn earned her PhD in Prevention Science in 2021 (PREV MS in 2020). She is also a Registered Dietitian Nutritionist (RDN). Anna is currently an Assistant Professor in the Food Science and Nutrition Department at California Polytechnic State University, San Luis Obispo. Her main responsibilities are to teach undergraduate and graduate nutrition classes, perform research, and serve the department, college, university, and the profession of dietetics. The classes she teaches range from Introduction to Human Nutrition to Community Nutrition. She advises students both at the undergraduate and graduate level in their research experiences and studies. Anna also performs prevention, wellness, and nutrition research, including projects related to cancer prevention for wildland firefighters, and the utilization of beef to increase whole grain consumption for children and emerging adults. She continues to volunteer professionally with the Commission on Dietetic Registration (CDR) with the NDTR and RDN entry level exams where she is a professional item writer and is on the exam panel—a position she has been working in for 8+ years.

In April 2024, Anna received the **Recognized Young Dietitian of the Year Award** through the California Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics and the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics. Congratulations Anna!

Jaida Ross, a PREV MEd student and member of the UO Track & Field team, set the collegiate record (19.71 meters) in the women's shot put in April. She followed that up with wins in both the shot put and discus events at the Pac-12 Championships. In the NCAA Prelims, Jaida broke her own shotput record, throwing for 20.01 meters and becoming the first collegiate woman to surpass 20 meters and only the 5th woman in the world to thow over 20 meters. This past weekend, Jaida also won the NCAA National Championship in the shotput. In the coming weeks, Jaida will be participating in the the US Olympic Trials in June. Congratulations Jaida!

This grant will allow her to travel to Tegucigalpa, Honduras to conduct focus groups with parents and caregivers to understand the impact of the intervention in their lives and the lives of their families. She is conducting this research with the <u>Center for Equity Promotion</u>.
